OBJECTIVES:

- To produce women students' who are globally competent by training them to acquire the required skill sets to meet every challenge
- To promote research and to instill the need to contribute towards development
- To facilitate academic and non-scholastic proficiency
- To foster the drive towards achieving excellence Intended outcomes
- To instill a value based academic curriculum to equip students' for employability and entrepreneurship
- To bridge the gap among the learners hailing from diverse backgrounds
- To produce able and qualified women citizens for nation building Underlying principle of the practice
- To empower women through quality education on the strong foundation of ethical, moral and cultural values

THE CONTEXT:

The students' in the beginning were hesitant and had shown moderate enthusiasm to participate in the discussions and deliberations due to first time higher education seekers. At the Parent-Teacher's association level, some parents opined that the awareness/sensitization programme are less effective and hence the very purpose of sending their wards to college is baseless. Gender sensitizations sessions were designed to expose the many disparities and in-equalities that were not noticed earlier. Under these circumstances, the college has thought it appropriate to forge ahead with the implementation of its objectives, for which various associations/Cells/Committees are created.

If the power is given to a man, he will become powerful, whereas if it is given to a woman, the family, in turn the society will become powerful. Empowering girl students through professional education integrated with values and moral ethics is to make an impact in the world. Integrating humanity, social values, ethics, leadership qualities with education transform the person into a good human being and real contribution done to the society. Teaching these values through subjects like Environmental science, Ethics, Gender sensation are part of the curriculum. But it is important to make them learn these aspects. These practices are really meant to empower girl students and to make them perfect women to influence the world.

In this world of equal opportunities, the institution has taken up the phenomenal task and responsibility to make every woman student who steps out of its portal to be well-equipped with the required skill sets. This drive towards instilling skills enables every student to take up each and every responsibility chosen by her or assigned to her at the national and international front and to fulfill it with utmost ethical, moral and intellectual efficacy.

THE PRACTICE:

1. Academic skills:

Academic proficiency is ensured through the implementation of CBCS curriculum offered under all the under-graduate, post-graduate and Ph.D. research programme. The continuous internal assessment incorporated through the conduct of regular tests, remedial sessions, assignments, seminars, paper presentations and the events offered, make students' become academically proficient and scholastic skills are imbibed in every student.

2. Technical skills:

Students are focused on various usage of internet and mobiles. Technology interface club of computer science organized lectures on awareness on basic internet concepts.

They are also focused on cyber network security to create awareness among students on secured usage on browsing the web, checking Email while using.

Training in computer lab, central instrumental facilities and laboratories helps the students' develop their technical skills thereby, equipping them for further higher studies and research.

The college offers compulsory computer training to every student at the entry level to ensure that every student as computer literate

3. Leadership skills:

Apart from regular character building sessions conducted by every department, renowned motivational speakers and special trainers (Teachers) are invited regularly to train students' to identify their strengths and weaknesses and are trained to convert their weaknesses into strengths, resulting in the development of their personality traits.

Students' are made to participate in Peer teaching, Group activities, Projects, inter and intra sports, cultural and academic events, college union activities, activities of various committees and Part V, extension and social outreach activities thereby training and promoting leadership skills among students'. Former outstanding students' of the institution are invited for instilling leadership qualities in the younger generation through OSA meeting.

4. Entrepreneurship skills:

Various departments organized seminars on "KNOW THYSELF", "AN EYE OPENER FOR AN EFFECTIVE CAREER", "WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS", "IMPORTANCE OF ENTREPRENEURS". Every program developed students' entrepreneurial skills thereby helping them to emerge as financially independent individuals who can provide job opportunities to many through their entrepreneurial ventures.

5. Career development skills:

Right from the day of her inception in to the undergraduate programme, every student is given training in English language communication skills through compulsory bridge course, language lab sessions and through a thorough exposure to communicative English for four semesters. The oral components in the continuous internal assessment, the compulsory seminar and paper presentation activities, and regular association activities along with the placement training ensure students' become proficient in communicating in English.

Special coaching classes are conducted to clear competitive exams through various department clubs and placement cell activities. TANSCH is arranging soft skill training to students for the betterment of their career.

6. Legal awareness skills:

In order to produce able and qualified women citizens for nation building Underlying principle of the practice, the legal awareness skills of the students are developed through seminars on “Rights to Information Act”, “Legal Awareness for Women”, “Women Security in Recent Years” conducted by various departments.

7. Interpersonal skills:

Training is given to students’ to develop their skills in yoga, sports and games, Arts, Fine Arts, oration, elocution, debating, writing etc., Programs like celebrations of wild-life week, UNO and story narration, speak English competitions, support the students to develop their interpersonal skills.

8. Human values:

Arranged seminars on “Value practices of life” explaining the psychology of the students and how to overcome their problems in life. Through the club of Human values and professional ethics the students learnt to work together, respect the views of others and developed sense of co-operation and ability to listen others.

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COMPUTER LITERACY PROGRAMME

Computer Literacy Programme (CLP) was introduced during the year 1999-2000. It was initiated by the Government of Tamil Nadu in all Government Colleges to enrich all under graduate non-Computer Science students. This is a Government recognized Certificate Programme initially implemented on contract with Elcot and NIIT. NIIT installed the computers with accessories and conducted the course for five years. Later it was undertaken by the Government of Tamil Nadu for which the syllabus was framed by the Directorate of Collegiate Education and the Lecturers were appointed on contract basis. This Programme was meant to instill basic computer skills to the entire student community pursuing UG courses in Government Colleges. Computer Education is available for all UG students in the college, in view of its importance in every walk of life.

The CLP course is beneficial to the non-computer science students within the campus with feasible fees structure, which enables them to do one additional certificate course along with their regular course. This training offers wide scope for their employment as the students hail from the rural areas. This Programme is effectively functioning in our college.

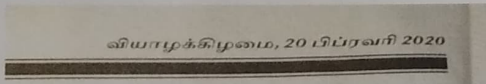
